School Dinners: Red Meat Concerns

As you know there have been a number reports in the media recently regarding concerns over the exact content of red meat products. This has led to the withdrawal of certain products and an ongoing criminal investigation. Understandably we have received several enquiries from parents concerned about our school dinners. Our lunches are prepared by All Saints Catholic High School and we have been given firm assurances by the catering manager there that all meat used in our school lunches, including red meat, comes from reputable suppliers which have been checked. As a consequence there is no need to change the current menu.

Medication

If your child is prescribed with life-saving medication which we need to store in school, for example asthma inhalers or epi-pens, it is the responsibility of parents and carers to ensure that there is sufficient, that items such as inhalers function correctly and that medication is not out of date. Ash Wednesday Community Mass

Our Mass for Ash Wednesday to mark the beginning of Lent was a very special occasion that brought our school and parish community. It was wonderful that we were joined by so many parents and friends from the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes. I would like to thank Father Paul for leading the celebration; Mr Burt for the music – which really was exceptional; the children who did the Powerpoint; our altar servers; the readers who were so clear and confident; the children involved in the Offertory Procession and all the other children, who were wonderful. I would also like to thank Miss Doherty for preparing the liturgy with Fr Paul.

Year 4 Assembly

I would like to thank the special young people of Year 4 and their teacher Miss Hardman for preparing today's wonderful assembly in which they shared their learning. They were all wonderful! Well done!

Collective Worship

After the holiday Collective worship will be slightly different. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday we will come together as a community each morning and share psalm and formal prayer taken from Mass. Both will be relevant to the season and will change each month. The aim is to build the children's understanding of our formal prayers and their relevance to our lives as Christians and people of faith. There will also be a global dimension and a focus for our prayers on different areas of the world. Each Thursday we will have a Liturgy of the Word at which the readings from the following Sunday will be shared. This simple service will be led by a different class each week.

Y2 Liturgy

The Year 2 liturgy planned for Tuesday 5th March at 10.00am will have to be rescheduled and we will inform you of the details at a later date.

Changes

After the holiday a new timetable will be introduced. As you have just read there will be a simple act of worship each day apart from Friday. There will also be a daily 'Read Write Inc' session for children throughout school to address gaps and develop ability and confidence in reading and writing. This will be supported by daily handwriting sessions and our approach to the teaching and learning of spellings will also be reviewed so that it links more consistently with what we are doing in literacy. This dynamic approach will see children grouped on ability and assessed every six weeks. Where appropriate the children will be moved to different groups for the following cycle. Once the children have reached a certain standard they will come off the programme will have English lessons as usual, but still supported by a traditional handwriting practise each day. On top of this, children who require additional support will work one-to-one with a member of staff three times per week in school time. The parents and carers of children on the programme will be invited to a workshop to explain the process fully in due course. We are also having a big push to make the learning environments more literacy-rich and this will include an updating of our library area and provision. In order to promote a love of books we have also timetabled story time at the end of the day.

We are also seeking to make school a more mathematics-rich environment. All children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) who have significant gaps in their understanding will have a 'Guardian Angel' – a member of staff who will work with them on a one-to-one or small group basis twice a week in order to build their mathematical confidence and help them overcome any barriers that are holding them back.

Parent/Carer Meetings

The rescheduled meetings will take place on Wednesday 6th March 2013 (the second week back). All appointments will be at the same time.

<u>Services of Reconciliation</u>

Lent is a special time of preparing for Holy Week and Easter. During this time we are encouraged to think about the way we live our lives and reflect on how we can make the necessary changes to stay close to God. As part of this journey the children of Years 4, 5 and 6 will have their own simple class-based Service of Reconciliation on Thursday 28th February. Each Service will be led by Father Paul supported by some colleague priests. During their service all eligible Catholic children will have an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confession. All other children will be given the opportunity to feel fully part of the reflection. I would like to thank Father Paul and Mrs Humphries for organising the Services.

INSET Day

I would like to remind you that Monday 25th February is an INSET Day and school will be closed.

Citizenship Award

The School Council has awarded the Citizenship Award to Niamh McGreal in Year 6. Niamh has impressed the Council with the way she conducts herself around school and particularly her good manners and consideration for the feelings of others. Just a few notes from the school office

Please could you ensure that money for any PTFA fundraising events is given to your child in a <u>separate envelope FAO PTFA</u> so that it can be put into the designated box in class and not just handed in at the school office or mixed in with dinner money, milk money, trip money etc. ALL MONIES (Dinners, Milk, Trip, SASH etc.) coming into school should be sent in with your child in the morning so that they can place it in the office box in the classroom enabling all money to be brought safely to the office by the monitor for the day.

LATENESS

The number of children arriving LATE in school (after 9.50am) has increased tremendously over the last few weeks. This will be monitored closely over the next half term – please remember that the Local Authority withdraw attendance information from the school database every week. Please try to set a good example to your child and arrive at school early enough for them to join their class in the playground before the bell each morning.

If your child does arrive late, the child or parents must report to the school office as soon as they arrive in order for the registers to be amended. PLEASE NOTE: Parents/Carers <u>must not</u> take their child to the classroom – a member of staff will take the younger children to class, KS2 children are able to make their own way to class.

After the half term holiday all parents will receive the usual Dinner Menus and Milk Letters for the Summer Term, which starts AFTER THE EASTER HOLIDAYS. As we have deadlines to meet for ordering of meals and milk PLEASE ensure that replies are returned to school by the date on the letters.
