# **Community Service of Remembrance**

# <u>School Dinners: Increased</u> Charge

The cost of school will have to increase when we return after the Christmas holiday from £1.90 to £2 per day. This is because Catering Department at All Saints Catholic High School – which prepares our meals – have had to put the price up. This means that the cost per child per week is now £10.

If you feel that you might be entitled to free school meals and would like some more information please contact us as soon as possible and we will advise you in confidence about what you should do.

The new menus for next term will be available next week. As all options meet government nutritional standards I urge you to discuss them carefully with your children so that they are happy with the choices made. Children really do need a good meal at lunchtime and it is difficult when they end up with a choice they are unhappy with. Thank you.

# Revised End of Day Arrangements for FS2, Year 1 and Year 2

Plans are in hand to lay a proper path to link the playground and the FS2 classroom (Reception) as the current path, designed and laid by the Probation Service and their 'Community Payback' workers has not worked. We are hoping to make a start on the new path after we become an academy on 1st December. In the meantime we have revised the routine at the end of the school day.

We would be grateful if all adults collecting children could now wait on the playground. This will minimise congestion in the small KS1 outdoor learning area and the path linking it to the main playground.

#### From next week:

- **FS2 children** will be brought down to the playground at earlier at 3.15pm to limit congestion
- Y1 children will be brought down the path to the playground
- Y2 children will continue to use the library exit

Obviously when the new path is finished we will review the end of day arrangements again, but if you can support us with these arrangements in the meantime, my colleagues and I would be very grateful.

We understand though that there will are times when parents/carers need to speak to a member of staff. However, I would ask you to be patient and wait until my FS2, Y1 and Y2 colleagues have made sure that every child in their respective class has either been collected by the right person or gone to the after-school club before speaking to them. At 'home time' staff need to be particularly vigilant and focused and I am sure that you will appreciate that this is difficult if a parent/carer is trying to speak to them at the same time. Thank you for your understanding.

He will meet the children, members of staff and PTFA who have been so instrumental in helping us to redevelop the library.
