Good News!

I am pleased to inform you that our results in the end of Key Stage statutory assessments are really positive and build upon last year's improvements.

- Y2 (End of KS1 statutory tests) 2013 national average is in brackets and 'L' means level
 - ✓ Reading: 100% at L2C+ (89%), 97% at L2B+ (79%) and 55% at L3+ (29%)
 - ✓ Writing: 83% at L2C+ (85%), 62% at L2B+ (67%) and 14% at L3+ (15%)
 - ✓ Mathematics: 100% at L2C+ (91%), 83% at L2B+ (78%) and 34% at L3+ (23%)
- Y6 (End of KS2 statutory tests) 2013 national average is in brackets
 - ✓ Reading: 97% at L4+ (86%), 66% at L5+ (44%) and 0% at L6 (0%)
 - ✓ Writing: 100% at L4+ (83%), 50% at L5+ (30%) and 7% at L6 (2%)
 - ✓ Mathematics: 100% at L4+ (85%), 60% at L5+ (41%) and 10% at L6 (6%)
 - ✓ Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: 97% at L4+ (74%), 80% at L5+ (48%) and 3% at L6 (2%)
 - \checkmark 50% exceeded their writing targets (the national figure in 2013 = 34%)
 - \checkmark 50% exceeded their mathematics targets (the national figure in 2013 = 34%)

These results will be amongst the best in the city and build on last year's good results. I am delighted for the children and their families as well as all the dedicated staff who have contributed in small ways and big to supporting our children and inspiring them to achieve so well. As good as these results are it is important though that we remain true to our ethos and focused on our long-term objectives so we can continue to improve.

More Good News!

I am delighted to be able to inform you that, as well as the money secured for the new kitchen and car park at the front of school my appeal for additional funds to improve fire safety provisions throughout school was upheld by the Education Minister. This means that in the last two years we have secured £385k. It is hope that work will begin in the Autumn. I will keep you informed of all developments.

Going for Gold

At St John Fisher we have set children's targets for progress and attainment above national expectations. The gold/yellow colour-coding on children's reports reflects where we are aiming for them to be, as achieving these ambitious targets will already mean that they have made more than government expected levels of progress. The green colour-coding is therefore reflective of truly exceptional progress.

Thank you to all those parents who have responded to our request for feedback on their child/ren's reports. This feedback has been mixed and has highlighted to us that there are some areas of the report which we need to think about, particularly in terms of presentation and explanation. I would therefore like to invite parents to contribute to a focus group discussion about how we go forward with the content and format of our end of year reports. This will take place in the autumn term next year and I will finalise and send out details when we return to school after the summer holiday. I hope as many of you as possible will be able to contribute to this focus group as your views and contributions are incredibly important to us.
