ENGLISH

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from a regular focus on handwriting, spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their individual needs in these specific areas and in writing too.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising spellings through repetition, games/online games and competitions
- ✓ practising handwriting if this is a personal target

Reciprocal Reading

All children will have daily access to reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ continuing to encourage your child to be independent when reading
- ✓ reading with your child everyday
- ✓ going through reading questions and checking answers particularly using the Bug Club resource

MATHEMATICS

We will focus on the following this term:

- understanding the properties of shape and investigating angles in triangle and quadrilaterals
- understanding, creating and interpreting graphs and charts
- calculating volume and converting between different units of measurement

Key words we will be using are:

✓ words relating to shape, space and measures

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ looking at how rectangles, triangles and circles can make composite shapes
- ✓ practising multiplication tables (Times Tables Rock Stars)

HUMANITIES

We will be learning about climate zones and biomes. We will use maps, atlases and globes to locate countries, continents and different biomes of the world. We will look at how organisms in a habitat depend on each other and rely on water and nutrients and how they adapt to their biome. We will consider threats to biomes.

Key words we will be using are:

The children will continue to benefit from our REAL PE programme as they focus on physical co-ordination and balance. The children will also be undertaking a unit of PE based using bat and ball skills included in the games of Cricket and Rounders.

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SCIENCE

In science we will be investigating how living things are classified based upon characteristics, similarities and differences. We will understand the broad groups and the sub divisional groups living things are classified into. We will also learn about the seven life processes and life cycles of different organisms.

MUSIC

The children will be taking a trip back in time to explore the history of music. We will cover a range of genres ranging from pop to rock 'n' roll; from jazz to garage and reflect on how musical icons helped shape the music we listen to today. We will explore how pop music was created and how the Beatles shaped the music we love today. We will learn about jazz and blues and explore how both shaped rock as a genre. As we draw closer to the year 2000, we will consider how the proliferation of sub-genres inspired original blends of music.
