Dear Parents and Carers,

This is the first curriculum overview of our new school year. Its purpose is to let you know what your children will be learning during the first term. We will also offer suggestions for supporting your children at home.

New learning can be fragile which is why it important to give our children the right kind of support in school and at home. If we get it right our children will feel positive and confident as they learn and make progress.

We do set homework to support and consolidate their new learning and to encourage the children. Our expectations regarding homework will therefore also be shared in this overview.

Children are always encouraged in school, and all we ask is that they do their best both in school and at home. We understand that children learn best when they are confident; they are most confident when they are happy; and they are most happy when they feel loved, supported and encouraged.

Clearly, it is important that homework is attempted by children <u>on their own</u>. If children do not understand something **they should** <u>never</u> worry. This means that the homework has done its job. If this happens then simply offer reassurance and encourage your children to do as much as they can. This will really help us to understand what they actually remember and know and where any gaps are, so that the right support can be offered.

If children have genuinely done their best we will always be proud of them, whatever they manage to do. We never want our children panicking or feeling anxious. If your child is stuck then simply notify staff in person, via the class email or by adding a note to the homework. Tell us what they remembered, could do and what they struggled with, so that we can follow it up with lots and lots of reassurance and the right kind of support.

With this in mind, please avoid the temptation to 'over-help' your children with homework tasks. This could end up masking important issues and delay children getting the help they need. Just offer encouragement and keep telling them that everyone at school will understand and will help and support them.

We know that ways of teaching and learning do change over time and so we are **always** happy to explain our approach if you are not sure and have questions. Please just ask. Children can find it more confusing if parents/carers try to show them what they remember being taught at school, especially if this is very different.

As always please contact us if you can offer support with any aspect of the curriculum overview perhaps because you have particular skills, knowledge or experiences, artefacts, useful contacts or you would like to volunteer to help us on an educational visit (subject to COVID guidance).

TERM 1 LEARNING VALUE

- spellings for a weekly spelling quiz each week (please work hard on these to meet new standards)
- cross-curricular theme-related homework at various other times

ENGLISH

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

Children will benefit from having regular handwriting and spelling practise, and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their *individual* needs. We will also focus on pupil's writing targets.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ supporting them and making sure they learn their weekly spellings
- √ talking about their targets for writing and the progress being made to achieve them

Reciprocal Reading

All children will have daily access to reading resources and twice each week will be completing reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading your child's reading books with them for a few minutes every day (as well as other books)
- ✓ encouraging your child to read a wider range of more challenging books, to widen their experience
- ✓ discussing their personal targets for reading (as shared on their record sheet from parent's meeting)
- ✓ learning the Y5/Y6 spellings







MATHEMATICS

This term we will focus on:

- reading, writing, ordering and comparing whole numbers to 1,000,000.
- recognising and continuing sequences of numbers using number patterns and relationships
- using our understanding of place value to multiply/divide whole numbers/decimals by 10, 100 and 1000

Key words we will be using are:

- √ numerals
- ✓ ten thousand
- ✓ one hundred thousand
- √ decimal point
- ✓ tenths/hundredths/thousandths

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ encouraging children to read and say large numbers as whole numbers not digits e.g. telephone numbers
 (248 5009 is read as two hundred and forty-eight thousand, five thousand and nine etc.)
- ✓ challenging children to multiply numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 in their heads

SCIENCE

This term we will look at Earth and Space. We will describe the movements of the earth and other planets; describe the movements of the sun and be able to explain day and night due to the Earth's rotation.

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune
- ✓ orbit
- √ axis
- ✓ gravity
- √ solar system

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ memorising the order of the planets and their size
- ✓ researching the orbits of different planets

PE

This term the children will continue learning through the 'Real PE' programme. We will be focusing on physical coordination and balance.

Key words we will be using are:

- √ target
- √ balance
- √ agility

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising ball skills such as throwing and catching
- ✓ practicing balancing at home





HUMANITIES

This term we will learn about life in the Ancient Egyptian times and the impact of Ancient Egypt on the world.

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ ancient
- √ civilization
- ✓ archaeology
- ✓ pharaoh
- √ dynasty
- √ excavation

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ researching information at home using books and the internet (safely)
- ✓ visiting museums
- √ finding Egypt and the Nile on a map and a globe

MUSIC

This term we will be playing percussion instruments. We will focus on using 'Boom Whackers' as we play a range of songs, both modern and classic. We will learn to develop chords and develop our own piece of music that will be performed.

Key words we will be using are:

- √ rhythm
- √ tempo
- ✓ pitch
- ✓ chords
- ✓ percussion

Junior Jam

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ encouraging children to talk about what they have learnt at school
- ✓ encouraging children to play music at home out of household objects

ART & DT

We will be looking at the art of Ancient Egypt, particularly the art that features in the tombs and temples devoted to the Egyptian pharaohs and gods.

We will also be undertaking food technology and in particular focusing on bread. We will look at the different types of bread and how they are made. We will also be making bread.

Key words we will be using are:

- √ hieroglyphics, palette
- ✓ yeast, dough, pitta, soda bread, leavened, unleavened

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ investigating at artwork and designs from Ancient Egyptian times
- √ looking for common features
- √ having a go at copying a piece of ancient Egyptian art
- ✓ considering how bread can form part of a balanced diet





COMPUTING

This term, we will be exploring game development.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- √ investigating the sounds and graphics used in various computer games
- ✓ exploring free applications (apps) that make objects move e.g. 'Scratch'

PSHCE

This term will be all about introductions and friendships as we begin the new school year.

Key words we will be using are:

- √ compromise
- √ reconciliation
- √ trust
- ✓ teamwork

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ discussing how to make friends in new settings and situations
- ✓ thinking about the things that make a friendship strong or weak

FRENCH

The lessons will be delivered by a specialist French teacher from the highly regarded Primary Languages Network. This term, the children will be focusing on talking about their feelings and emotions, describing someone in the third person and writing extended sentences.

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ et

- √ parce que
- ✓ je suis heureux
- √ ie suis triste
