
### Weekly Liturgy of the Word

#### Remembrance Lessons & Class Reflections

In the build up to our Service of Remembrance the children in all classes learned about Remembrance Day and reflected on its origins, significance and place in the life of the United kingdom. The children had opportunities to ask lots of questions and share their thoughts and personal prayers. They each made poppies for their class wreaths. I would like to thank my colleagues for preparing and supporting the children so well.

#### SJF Community Service of Remembrance

On Wednesday, our national Armistice Day, our community came together in order to remember the dead and injured of the First World War and of all conflicts since. We remembered the brave members of our armed services; their families; civilians and those on all sides affected by war. This year we were able to gather in Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church for a beautifully simple act of remembrance that was led by the young people of Y6.

During the course of our Service our Y6 children shared readings and poems as they provided a commentary on the origins and significance of Remembrance Day for our United Kingdom. They also shared special prayers of thanksgiving in honour of all those affected by war; including those killed or injured in the service of our nation – as well as those who love or loved them. We also remembered all civilian victims of war around the world, especially the children.



Later in the Service, simple class wreaths, made up of paper poppies that had been created by each child, were laid at the foot of our simple wooden cross, and, as 'The Last Post' was played in an otherwise silent church, everything was still as we all took a moment to reflect and offer our own silent prayers for peace.

## Class Advent Liturgies

As part of our preparations for Christmas there will be daily Advent class liturgies taking place in all classes except on PE days of on days when children are timetabled to have either French or Music in the last period of the school day. Sadly we will not be able to invite family and friends to join us.

## Nativity Plays

A reminder that following public health advice we will not be inviting family and friends in to school, as we hoped, in order to watch our nativity plays this year. This decision was made reluctantly and on public health advice. We do appreciate how special these moments are, but the reality is that the COVID pandemic remains an ongoing concern. We do understand that there will be disappointment and so we thank you for your continuing patience and for the trust you have in us to do all we need to, in order keep everyone safe - including making difficult decisions like this. Your continuing support is appreciated greatly, thank you.

A reminder that we have arranged for a specialist film company to record both the **FS2** and **KS1** nativity plays this year. Though nothing will compare to being physically present, it is our sincere hope that a professionally produced DVD will at least provide families with a treasured memento and that this might go a small way to making up for the fact that we have not been able to invite them in to see the performances this year.

Both nativity plays will be filmed on **Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2021**, and so it is important that all the children are in school on that day. Once the films have been edited professionally, they will be available to purchase directly from the film company. A reminder that the prices are as follows:

- a basic DVD is £9.99 and a DVD customised with a message e.g. to a relative for a gift is £12.99
- a basic USB is £12.99 and USB customised with a message e.g. to a relative for a gift is £15.99

Individual children will not be named nor will the films be uploaded to our website. We appeal to parents, carers, family and friends to **NOT** upload any part of the films either as video clips or stills to social media in case the images of other children are included, which might raise objections from their parents/carers.

Parents and carers who do **not** want their children to be filmed are asked to contact us as soon as possible. Their children will still be able to take part in the performance, just like their peers, and they will be able enjoy



the experience of being on stage, in costume, with all the other children. Their image/scenes will then be edited by the film company so that they do not appear in the finished DVD, before it goes on sale.

Photographs of the children in nativity groups will also be taken - as they always are - and these will be made available to view and download via our website. Again we request that no images are then uploaded and shared on social media. Only photographs of those children for whom we have permission will appear on our website and no one will be named. The photographs of children who are not allowed to have their image on the school's website will be given to their parents/carers directly, so that they have a special keepsake.

A reminder that this is scheduled to take to place on **Tuesday 21st December 2021** and involves all the children in Years 3 to 6. As with everything we will not be able to invite family and friends to join us but our Service will be filmed and a recording made available to watch shortly afterwards by clicking <u>here</u>.
