St George's Art Day

The following article was written by Mr Smith about our special Art Day for the Sheffield Star:

"Once more unto the breach, dear friends, once more!" was how the children at St John Fisher celebrated St George's Day and British values.

The children came off the normal curriculum timetable to undertake a day entirely dedicated to art and design: painting, drawing and sculpture. The focus for their work was based upon Paolo Uccello's Painting of "Saint George and the Dragon" painted in 1470. The children were to use this as a basis to understand the idea of heroes and produce art work of their own.

There was lots of discussion about the story of Saint George slaying the dragon before the children began their own works of art. Some of the older children



also experienced Shakespeare's "Cry God for Harry, England and St George" speech from Henry V as inspiration for their work. The children discussed heroes and their own ideas of what a hero is based upon their own lives and experiences. This also led to investigations and discussion about "Great Britons" as ambassadors for our country in such areas as: art, literature, science, politics and sport to name just a few.

Some really amazing and imaginative pieces of work have been generated by the children, in a day which highlighted the mythology of Saint George and the dragon and also allowed children to explore British values through people who have given so much to others and England in the spirit of Saint George.

Huge thanks must go to Mrs Darken who coordinated the whole day and supported colleagues with resources and ideas, but also led the event with such enthusiasm that is was impossible not to fully embrace and engage with the theme of the day. Both children and staff had a fantastic time which will definitely lead to many more events like these.

Currently the school is look at ways to display the art work around the school, so all children and staff can appreciate each other's creativity and imagination. This was simply a fantastic day of learning experienced through lots of different methods and media.

The artwork will be exhibited in the school hall from **3.00pm** on **Monday 27th April** so that it can be viewed before the children are collected at the end of the school day. You are all very welcome.
