## Fair Trade

As part of a joint project with the Birley Family of Schools and linking to our current RE topic the whole school have been involved in learning about Fair Trade and ethical enterprise.

This is a topic that we will return to next year as it fits in with the school ethos and enables the pupils to gain a greater understanding of where many products originate from.

Here is a flavour of some of the activities from through school:



Our School Councillors led a fair trade assembly to the whole school aiming to teach about the supply chain of bananas.

In **FS2** we learned about Jamaica, the music, the culture and how the climate is different from the UK. We learned about the life cycle and growth of bananas in Jamaica. We agreed that growing bananas looks really hard work. We then learned about Foncho a banana grower in South America and the difference getting a fair price for his bananas makes to his family. We also used the CAFOD website to learn about a shop that only sells fair trade products. This shop helps to ensure that people get a fair price for the hard work they put in to producing our food. We know it is possible to be an ethical entrepreneur

In **Y2** we looked at how and where cocoa is grown and processed into chocolate. We found out that chocolate bars have a story of their own. It goes back 4000 years. Cocoa beans, the ingredient that makes the chocolate flavour, was so prized it was used as currency by the Aztecs. We also learned about how it is farmed and processed into a chocolate bar that we eat.

In **Y5** we learned about how and where cotton is grown. We found out the differences between fair trade cotton farmers and non-fair trade cotton farmers. We also learnt that the multiple gold medal rower, Sir Steve Redgrave, has his own clothing company and he uses fair trade cotton. **Please watch out for the Fair Trade and Enterprise display at the whole school exhibition!**

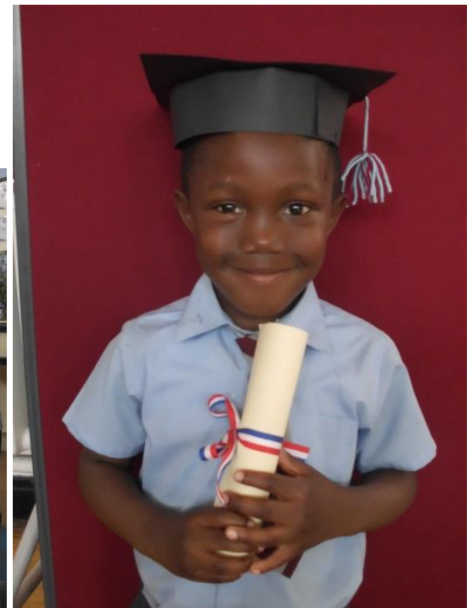

They spent the day walking through the park, enjoying the wonderful scenery and learning about the Chatsworth Estate. The children also did some landscape drawings and played some games. 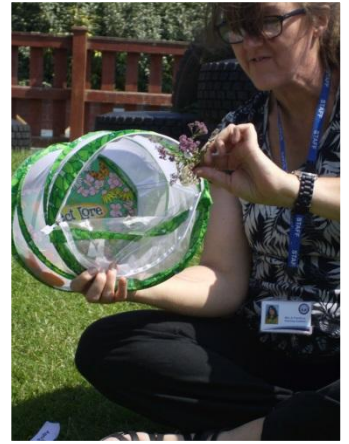
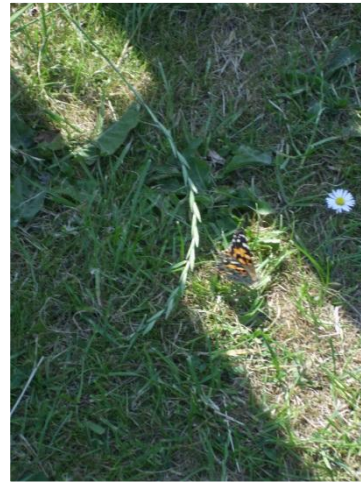
### Bye Bye Butterflies!
