Questionnaires

Free School Meals

If you think that you might be able to claim free school meals it is very important that you contact us so that we can help you – in confidence – to apply for what you are entitled to. The process is very private and children receiving free school meals are treated exactly the same as every other child especially with the new online ordering system.

St John Fisher receives a grant to support children who successfully apply for free school meals which is used to support them in school. This grant is called the 'Pupil Premium'. So it is very important that you let us know if you think that you might be entitled.

Currently children in Foundation Stage 2 (FS2), Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals under a government-funded scheme. However, even for these families it is VERY important that parents/carers contact us if they are in receipt of any kind of income-based benefit as their children might also be entitled to a Pupil Premium grant even though they are receiving free school meals because of their age.

Please speak to my colleagues in the School Office if you would like to find out more.

Please remember that dinner choices can be made for the following week at any point up to midnight on Thursday and you can even make meal choices for several weeks at a time if this is more convenient.

Please also remember that when you make choices you select a main course <u>and</u> a dessert. Thank you


