Statutory End of key Stage Tests (SATs)

As you know, the children of Years 2 and 6 will undertake their final end of Key Stage statutory assessments in the coming weeks. These are often referred to as SATs. These assessments are very important for all schools because they are used as one way of measuring and judging performance and effectiveness.

You may well be aware from the media that there have been a number of significant changes in education in recent years, months and days which are having a huge impact on children and schools.

These changes include the removal of 'Levels' as a means of measuring pupil achievement; the introduction of a new National Curriculum with expectations significantly higher than its predecessor; and the transformation of the tests the children do at the end of Years 2 and 6.

In common with colleagues in schools everywhere, we have been working hard to adapt to the changes and prepare our children. We have reviewed our curriculum; our approaches to teaching and learning; and the way we track pupil progress and achievement so that we can help our young people meet the new national standards and expectations whilst remaining true to our ethos and core values.

Next week the young people of Y6 will be having a run through and so it is very important that they attend school every day. The actual Y6 assessments take place from Monday 9th May to Thursday 12th May 2016, and again it is vital that the children attend every day. The assessments for children in Y2 are different. Though they will do some tests to inform Mrs Broadhead's assessment of their knowledge and abilities, her final judgements can also take account of the knowledge and abilities they have demonstrated in class day in, day out leading up to this point.

As a community, we understand the importance of these assessments however we also never forget that each child is special and their welfare and happiness at school is very important. We therefore work hard to make the preparations as fun and engaging as possible and aim to ensure that our young people always feel valued, supported and affirmed. Whatever the outcome of the tests, we are very proud of them all.

Community History Project

Here is an important message from Mrs Holloway:

As part of our local (Birley) family of schools we made a successful bid to the 'First World War Now and Then Heritage Lottery Fund'! This is means that over the next two years St John Fisher has the funding to support our Y5 children and whole community to research Sheffield's home front family stories related to the First World War. Stories of the home front are less well-known, so this is our chance to tell some of Sheffield's story.

The children will be asking research questions for members of the community to answer. There will be free opportunities for people in our community to be trained in research techniques by the Sheffield Library Service and take part in a visit to the Liddle Collection in Leeds.

Experts will be visiting our school, children will be sharing their new knowledge and there will be free community events and lots of opportunities for children to write.

Our particular area of research is: entertainment. The children have already come up with some research questions. They would like to find out about home entertainment (books, toys and music); going out (cinema and films); and sport – specifically football (including women's football) and horse racing.

The second half of the project involves a young people's writer who will work with the then year sixes to create a script which they will perform after their SATs. We hope to hold a massive celebratory event for all the community to watch the play and look at an exhibition of the children's work and the research.


