Mrs Dorothy Campbell RIP

I am very sad to inform you that Mrs Dorothy Campbell died last weekend. Mrs Campbell was a tremendous friend of our school. Her children attended St John Fisher not long after it opened and she started working at school herself as secretary on 11th January 1965. She remained in this role for twenty-eight years, eventually retiring on 23rd July 1993 in order to care for her husband who was seriously ill at the time.

In 1994 she returned to school as a volunteer, helping staff and supporting children, initially for three days per week, finally stopping altogether just three years ago. As a volunteer she enjoyed baking, doing craft activities, reading with the children and helping with educational visits – especially in FS2 and Years 1 and 2. She continued to visit school to watch the children's performances and concerts and was looking forward to being involved in our 60th anniversary celebrations next June.

Mrs Campbell was also a great servant of the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes over many years, stepping back from managing bookings for the Parish Centre only a matter of days before she died. She will be remembered fondly - always - by both her school and parish communities for her many years of selfless and dedicated service. Passionate about her parish and passionate about her school she has, in her own special and matter-of-fact way, simply been an inspiration - and we will really miss her.

Her funeral takes place at 10.15am on Tuesday 13th December 2016 at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church. We pray for her and we pray for her family. May God grant her eternal rest.
