

SJF Open Morning 2016

We are especially interested in welcoming the parents and carers of children who are due to start school next September. It will be a good opportunity to meet children, staff, Governors and members of the PTFA.



Smileys

This week's smileys will be added to next week's totals, and the scores published in the newsletter.

We are in the process of reviewing our reward system and have been looking at different options. We are looking at adopting a system that will enable parents and carers to check their children's smiley totals (and the reason they were given) via an app which can be used on a smartphone. We are looking at introducing this system from the beginning of Term 2 and in the meantime will run with the current system.

For those of you unsure about how this works, within the current system children receive smileys from members of staff for good behaviour, effort, achievement, attitude and manners. A 'smiley' looks like a coin. This is given to the child and then marked off against their chart by the class teacher. The smiley is then deposited by the child in the Smiley box (in the hall) in the section for their 'House'. This means that when a child earns a smiley it benefits him/her and adds to the collective total for their House each Term.

I am aware that there have been one or two issues regarding children depositing their smileys and then forgetting to tell their teacher, or simply not depositing their smiley, not telling the children and then losing the smileys at home or elsewhere. This has meant that they have not been credited with the smiley (unless it has been noticed by adults and put right). We are therefore looking at options to tighten the process and ensure that children get everything they are entitled to.

Under the current system children receive a Bronze Award when they achieve 100 smileys, a Silver Award when they achieve 200 smileys and a Gold Award when they achieve 300 smileys. We are also looking at this as part of the review and will publish details of any changes when they are finalised later this term.

We will retain our four Houses and the popular colour days to mark the various feast days of the patron saints. We celebrate the feast days on Mondays and Fridays so that they do not clash with PE for children in Years 1-6 who wish to come to school dressed in the House colours and not PE kit.

Flu Vaccinations

As part of an initiative led by NHS England nasal flu vaccinations are being offered to children in FS2 Years 1, 2, 3 and 4. According to the Director of Clinical Services there is good evidence from previous vaccination programmes across the country about the benefits of immunising healthy children in order to reduce the transmission of Flu and to reduce absenteeism in schools for both children and staff.
