End of Key Stage 2 Statutory Tests (SATs)

Next week our fantastic Y6 pupils will join young people across the country in sitting their end of Key Stage 2 tests, otherwise known as SATs. It is therefore very important that the children attend school every day, having benefitted from a decent night's sleep and a good breakfast. The tests they face are one of the ways in which the performance of schools are checked. The outcomes of the tests provides inspectors with evidence to measure a school's effectiveness in delivering the high quality education that all children deserve.

However, the outcomes of these tests cannot ever tell the whole story of what special places schools are, nor can they (or should they) ever be used to define our amazing young people. In 2015 a Headteacher in another school wrote a beautiful letter to her Y6 children which really resonated with me. I want to share some of what she said and add some thoughts of my own.

Dear Y6 children,

The SATs tests do not assess all what makes each of you special and unique. The people who create these tests (and score them) do not know each of you, the way that we do, and certainly not in the way your families do.

They do not know that some of you speak two languages or that you love to sing or draw.

They have not seen your natural talent for dancing or playing a musical instrument.

They do not know that your friends can count on you to be there for them; that your laughter can brighten the darkest day or that your face turns red when you feel shy.

They do not know that you participate in sports, wonder about the future, or sometimes help your little brother or sister or parents after school.

They do not know that you are kind, trustworthy and thoughtful and that every day you try to be your very best. They have not seen you conquer fears bravely or overcome those obstacles which have held you back.

The outcomes of these tests will reveal some things, but they cannot reveal everything, because there are many, many ways to be smart - and you are all very smart!

So while you are busy preparing for (and doing) the tests please remember that there is no way to 'test' all of the amazing and awesome things that make you, YOU!

Aristotle said: "Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all" and at St John Fisher everyone believes this to be an absolute truth.

So always be proud of who you are and remember we believe in you and always will...


All Saints Admissions 2018/19 Workshop
