Here is an important message from Mrs Darken and the School Council

The School Council is organising a whole-school 'Bake Off' to raise money for School Council funds!

Every child in school is invited to bake a cake and enter in to the competition.



The cakes will be judged in year groups and each year group has been given a theme and each class will watch their cakes being judged. There is also a parent's and teachers' prize, so it is time to dust off your oven gloves! Prizes will be given to the winning entries. Please bring your cakes in to the school hall on the morning of **Monday 22<sup>nd</sup>** May and put them on the correct table for your child's Year grouping.

Please label your entry with the name and class on the <u>bottom</u> of the cake so that judging is anonymous.

Where possible please <u>refrain</u> from using nuts or nut products in the cakes you make, as some of our pupils have serious nut allergies. If nuts/nut products are used please highlight this fact in the ingredient list.

Please do <u>not</u> use fresh cream as we are unable to refrigerate the cakes and once the cakes have been judged they will be cut up and sold. The cake sale will take place at the end of school on **Monday 22**<sup>nd</sup> **June**.

All the money raised will go directly in to School Council funds and will be spent by School Council on resources for the School. We really hope you can support this event by either baking a cake or by buying a cake from the cake sale.


