Here is an important message from Mrs Darken and the School Council

*The School Council is organising a whole-school 'Bake Off' on **Monday 22nd May** to raise money for School Council funds and all the children and parents are invited to bake a cake and enter in to the competition! The more the merrier!*

The cakes will be judged in year-group categories, with each year group working to a theme chosen by the Council. Each class will watch their cakes being judged.

There will also be a parent's and teachers' prize, so it is time to dust off your oven gloves and have a go! All winners will receive a prize. Please bring your cakes in to the school hall on Monday morning and place them on the correct table for your child's class. Please label your entry with the name and class on the bottom of the cake so that judging is anonymous.

Where possible please refrain from using nuts or nut products in the cakes you make, as some of our pupils have serious nut allergies. If nuts/nut products are used please highlight this fact in the ingredient list.

Please do not use fresh cream as we are unable to refrigerate the cakes and once the cakes have been judged they will be cut up and sold. The cake sale will take place at the end of school on Monday.

All the money raised will go directly to School Council to be spent on resources for the school chosen by the Councillors. We really hope you will support this event by baking a cake and/or by buying a cakes!

"Every kilometre you walk together will help us continue to be there for people across Sheffield, when they need us most," says Events Co-ordinator Greg van Heeswijk.


