Our whole-school attendance is similar to last week, meaning that it is still below our school target. The local authority is working with us and other schools currently in order to support excellent attendance across the city, and so in consultation with them letters were sent out this week to the families of children who have less than 94% attendance. We understand that absences can be for many reasons and often it is the case that parents/carers are simply not aware that their children's absences and 'lates' are creeping up - and may be emerging as an issue affecting their wellbeing and progress. This is why we share information regularly in the weekly newsletter, pupils' progress and achievement reports and in these letters. Anyone concerned about their child's attendance or punctuality are encouraged to contact us so we can offer support.

Weekly Liturgy of the Word


