## Be Safe - Be Happy Week

The first week of Term 2 (straight after the forthcoming holiday) will be 'Be Safe-Be Happy Week'. The week is an extended version of the national UK Anti-Bullying Week taking place later in November. Our focus will be on pupil wellbeing. During the week the children will explore a wide range of issues linked to being safe and happy.

There will be a special focus in each class exploring why it is important to be kind, accepting and supportive of others; considering the different forms of bullying. The children will also reflect on what they need to do if they witness or experience bullying.

Though we have an ongoing focus on online safety throughout the year, the children will think about how to be safe online and what to do if they feel unsure, unsafe or bullied online. We are also looking to run more parent/carer sessions after school during the week.

## There will be:

- a special road Safety day coordinated by our partners from Gist; and
- information shared by South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue (who, unfortunately, cannot visit school)

There will be class talks and assemblies led by:

- South Yorkshire Police on a range of issues including 'stranger danger' and nuisance behaviour;
- Yorkshire Water on safety near rivers, canals and open water;
- Network Rail/British Transport Police on safety near railways; and
- a building company representative about safety near building sites

There will be a 'Fun & Fitness Day' led by our partners from LINKS and a skipping workshop for all classes on another day

We are also waiting to confirm talks on the following:

- the school nurses regarding basic first aid for most children, and for the oldest children a talk about the dangers of smoking, alcohol and drugs;
- the school dental service about oral health and hygiene; and
- 'The National Grid' about being safe around electricity in the home and electricity pylons and substations

We will publish the final programme once everything has been confirmed. Please look out for it as the children will be asked to wear their PE kits on the days of 'Fun & Fitness' and skipping workshop days.

## **Community Service of Remembrance 2017**

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2017 our community will come together to mark Armistice Day 2017. Our service will be at 10.30am at Our Lady Lourdes Catholic Church and will incorporate a minute's silence in honour of the fallen and those who love(d) them.

If you, a relative or someone you know is a serving or retired member of the armed services and would like to play a small part in our service (placing a wreath created by the children at the foot of a cross), please let us know.



Also we are looking for serving and/or retired service personnel who would be willing to visit school in order to speak to the children about why Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday is so important to them. Again if you can help, please get in touch.
