On Tuesday we will be visited by an HMI who will be working with us whilst we progress out of our current 'Special Measures' category. He will be keen to get to know the school and understand the journey we have been on over the past twelve months and most importantly since the OFSTED report was published.

Pupil Premium & Free School Meals

The pupil Premium is fund established by the government which is awarded to schools so that they can offer additional support to children:

- Whose parents are serving in the military
- Who are 'looked after children'
- Eligible to free school meals.

If your child falls within one or more of these categories it is important that you contact school so that we can claim the premium on behalf of your child. We are obliged to share what we do to support children entitled to the Pupil Premium and demonstrate that we are doing all we can to maximise the opportunities for those children in school. I would like to reassure you that children in receipt of the premium are not singled out. On the contrary it can fund additional support in school that will ensure that they have the same opportunities as everyone else.

A letter will be sent home by Mrs Battams shortly explaining how you can claim free school meals if you feel that you could be entitled to them. Nationally it is an issue that many parents who are entitled to claim free school meals choose not to for fear that this will cause embarrassment to their children. Let me reassure you that the systems we have in place will not allow this to happen. I therefore urge you strongly to please claim free school meals if you are entitled. Earrings & PE

Currently pupils are permitted to wear small, plain and simple silver or gold studs to school if they have their ears pierced. Pupils are not permitted to wear earrings or anything that dangles from their ear(s). They are also not permitted to wear brightly coloured plastic studs or anything with diamante etc.

Pupils are only allowed to wear small, plain and simple silver or gold studs.

Children are not permitted under school and local authority procedures to wear studs during PE lessons. They MUST be removed **by the child** before the lesson. The guidance does not allow them to use a sticky plaster to cover them and adults in school are not permitted to help them either. If your child cannot remove his/her own studs then we ask that they do not wear them at all on a PE day.

PE is an important curriculum subject and I am sure you will understand that it is not acceptable for children to miss it merely because they are wearing studs in their ears that they cannot remove.
