COVID-19 Update

As part of our ongoing efforts to keep our school community as COVID-ready as possible we have taken the following steps this week...



NHS Test and Trace

We now have a school **QR Code** to support NHS Test and Trace for visitors e.g. contractors, visiting teachers and other multi-agency partners. In line with other schools we will not be asking parents, carers and others who come to school simply drop off/pick up children at either end of the school day to 'check in' unless advised otherwise by the government or public health authorities at some future point.

Updated Risk Assessment

Our comprehensive SJF COVID-19 risk assessment has been updated and we are now on version 8. Our risk assessment aligns closely to the template provided by Sheffield City Council and our city's Director of Public Health, Greg Fell and his excellent team. Home Learning

Sadly, it is inevitable that from time to time children will need to isolate, either because they themselves have COVID symptoms or because they have been contact with someone who has.

Children who have COVID symptoms and are unwell will not have to engage with home learning until they are well enough. Children who are isolating but are well and do not have symptoms **will** be expected to engage fully with the home learning opportunities that we will provide.

Initially they will have an 'Isolation Pack' of learning activities. From the second full week they will be provided with a plan detailing links to online lessons and activities that will follow what their peers are learning in school whilst they are away.









We will do all we can to minimise the impact on children who have to isolate, and we will continue working hard to help those children who need help catching up because of the last lockdown. SJF home learning activities will be online and delivered through either (a) Microsoft Teams (guides available on the home page of our SJF website or by clicking here) or (b) our own 'SJF Home Learning Portal', for Education of OUI SUF WEDSHE OF BY CHECKING TICK.

Y3

Y4

Y5

To celebrate National Poetry Day in Y5, we read poems by CS Lewis, Hillaire Belloc and Roald Dahl. We also wrote our own poems about Earth & Space and Ancient Egypt (our Science and History topics this term). To write our poems we used an 'a,a,b,b' rhyme scheme.

Y6

In Y6, we looked at a variety of poems including some old classics such as 'The Owl and the Pussy Cat' and 'Tyger, Tyger'. We also listened to more modern poems and had a giggle at the poem the teachers recited to us! We listened to a poem story book called 'The Cow Tripped Over the Moon and other Nursery Rhyme Emergencies.' Afterwards we had a go at writing our own versions to give to the FS2 children.
