COVID-19 Update

What does self-isolation actually mean?


Director of Public Health in Sheffield, **Greg Fell**, has clarified what self-isolation actually means and he has underlined the importance of following the guidelines in order to limit the spread of COVID-19.



He recommends thinking ahead and having a plan in place in case you do have to self-isolate. He suggests that your plan should address the following questions:

- How would you get supplies?
- How would you isolate away from others in your household?
- Where would you choose to isolate?
- What would you do whilst in isolation?

Home Learning Reminder

Children who have COVID symptoms and are unwell do not have to engage with home learning. Children who are isolating and are well **will** be expected to complete the home learning opportunities that we provide.

To thee do we send up our sighs,


Mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.

Achievements outside of School




Statement to Live By
