TERM 5 LEARNING VALUE: TEAMWORK

This term the Learning Value that we are thinking particularly about is PASSION.

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SPELLING, PUNCTUATION, GRAMMAR & HANDWRITING

All children will benefit from having daily handwriting and spelling practise, and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their individual needs. Children have individual targets for writing, such as including specific punctuation and these will be focussed on throughout all their writing.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ supporting them to learn their weekly spellings
- \checkmark looking at synonyms and antonyms.
- talking about their targets for writing

RECIPROCAL READING

All children will have daily access to reading resources and twice each week will be completing reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading their own books with them for a few minutes every day
- ✓ choosing another book by the same author, to read with your child
- ✓ encouraging your child to read a wider range of more challenging books, to widen their experience
- ✓ discussing their personal targets for reading (as shared on their record sheet)

MATHEMATICS

This term we will be focusing on the new Y4 mathematics:

- continuing to work on shapes and symmetry (looking at angles and classifying them as 'acute', 'obtuse' or 'right angles')
- position and direction, describing positions on a 2-D grid as coordinates and describe movement between points as a translation using correct units
- 3-D Shapes: recapping 3-D shape names and properties before being introduced to different 3-D shapes

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ symmetrical
- ✓ translating
- ✓ coordinates
- ✓ polygon

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ playing games to practise the skills
- ✓ investigating different angles that are found around the home
- ✓ continuing to learn times tables and related division facts

HUMANITIES

Our focus will be on the Greece and comparing to the UK. The children will be learning about the Geographical features of both places and compare them. They will identify how changes to a place will affect people living there and understand how people improve their environment.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

PE

The children will benefit from a programme called Real PE. This term the children will focus on Orienteering.

SCIENCE

We will be continuing to learn about what electricity is and how it was discovered. Children will construct circuits, start to create pictorial circuits and conduct an investigation into how easily different types of switches can break and reconnect a circuit.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ investigating appliances which use electricity in their home and listing them
- ✓ exploring the potential dangers of using electricity and discussing how to keep safe

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ circuits
- ✓ positive and negative charges
- ✓ symbols
- ✓ components

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- investigating which appliances which use electricity at home and listing them
- ✓ exploring the potential dangers of using electricity and discussing how to keep safe

MUSIC

This half term the children will explore, create and refine their skills on keyboards! Using their previous 'boomwhacker' knowledge, the children will develop an understanding of chords and how practising scales can help shape their own songs. We will dive into musical theory; debating which notes work well together and spend plenty of time on creating unique songs and performing in front of others.

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ sound (overtone, timbre, pitch, amplitude, duration)
- ✓ melody/harmony
- ✓ rhythm
- ✓ texture
- ✓ structure/form
- ✓ expression (dynamics, tempo)



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You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ asking children about their Music lessons and what they have enjoyed learning about
- ✓ listening to a wide variety of music with your children and talk about the similarities and differences

FRENCH

This term we will be exploring France, learning how to share our information and engaging in simple dialogues.

Key words we will be using are:

- ✓ Où habites-tu? (where do you live?)
- \checkmark J'habite à (I live in)
- ✓ tu habites à...? (do you live in...?)
- ✓ et toi? (and you?)

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- playing, listening, recognition, recall/ storing in memory games
- ✓ practising the spoken word and experiment with the written word in order to create dialogue

COMPUTING

We are meteorologists! The children will recognise how weather reports are formed through the data collected by computers.

Key words we will be using are:

✓ data ✓ graphs

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ discussing what to do if they need help in an online portal
- encouraging them to be open and honest about their use and understanding of technology

PSHCE

We will be continuing to learn about how our bodies are changing with a focus on recognising that each one of us is different but also the same.

Key words we will be using are:

✓ body ✓ responsibility ✓ changing ✓ support

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- considering the attitudes and values that exist towards others.
- \checkmark discussing the changes that your child's body might be going through.
