It promotes positive behaviour by encouraging older buddies to act as positive role models to the younger buddies. Buddies will have lots opportunities to meet each other both informally and during lesson time throughout the school year.

Foundation Stage 2 (FS2)

On Monday we welcome our new children and the whole community is really excited. This week the FS2 team have been visiting every child and their parents/carers in their homes – a really valuable opportunity to share information, offer reassurance, share advice and – for brand new parents especially – start building those important relationships on which successful schools depend.

Building Improvements

Over the summer the Y3, Y4 and Y5 classrooms were decorated along with the toilets near the Y5 classroom. The building of the new kitchen and alterations to the school hall were delayed whilst I appealed to the Minister of Education against the decision not to award us a grant to upgrade the building to bring it in to line with new fire protection standards. As you know the appeal was upheld and both projects merged. Architects and surveyors are now working on plans and have put the work out to tender with a view to starting at October half-term. The planned completion date is January 2015. I intend putting the plans on the website as soon as they are finalised and will keep you informed of developments.
