TERM 5 LEARNING VALUE: TEAMWORK

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ENGLISH

SPELLING, PUNCTUATION, GRAMMAR & HANDWRITING

All children will benefit from having daily handwriting and spelling practise, and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their individual needs. Children have individual targets for writing, such as including specific punctuation and these will be focussed on throughout all their writing.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- supporting them to learn their weekly spellings
- looking at synonyms and antonyms.
- talking about their targets for writing

RECIPROCAL READING

All children will have daily access to reading resources and twice each week will be completing reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- reading their own books with them for a few minutes every day
- choosing another book by the same author, to read with your child
- encouraging your child to read a wider range of more challenging books, to widen their experience
- discussing their personal targets for reading (as shared on their record sheet)

MATHEMATICS

This term we will focus on:

- converting between different units of measure
- calculating the perimeter and area of shapes
- identifying 3-D shapes
- identifying and drawing angles

Key words we will be using are:

- imperial
- metric
- perimeter
- area
- obtuse
- acute

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- encouraging your child to measure objects around the home and to convert them into different units
- challenging your child to estimate the volume and capacity
- challenging your child to estimate angles

HUMANITIES

We will be exploring the geography and history of France. We will learn about France's place withing western Europe, as well as many of its geographical features, and we will investigate the historical events that led to the French Revolution.

Key words we will be using are:

✓ republic

✓ egality

✓ fraternity

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You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ researching with your child the major cities of France or significant French people
- ✓ using a map to identify France, as well as the countries that border it

PF

The children will continue to benefit from our REAL PE programme as they focus on physical co-ordination and balance. The children will also be undertaking a unit of PE based using bat and ball skills included in the games of Cricket and Rounders.

Key words we will be using are:

SCIENCE

This term we will be investigating how various animals, including humans, change throughout their lifecycle. We will compare and contrast different animals, identify changes specific to humans and explore the reasons for these changes.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ researching different animals, including mammals, amphibians, reptiles and birds
- ✓ watching nature programmes with your child that inform them of the life processes of different animals.

MUSIC

This half term the children will explore, create and refine their skills on keyboards! Using their previous boomwhacker knowledge, the children will develop an understanding of chords and how practising scales can help shape their own songs.

Key words we will be using are:

√ texture

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ asking your child to talk about what they enjoyed learning in their Music lessons
- ✓ listening to a wide variety of current and older music with your children and talking about the similarities and differences

FRENCH

This term we will be extending our understanding of singular and plural nouns, listening to and joining in with French songs and continuing to learn about parts of the body.
