The children will not access their current classes, as we need to keep bubbles separate. All areas will be cleaned before children to return to their own classes.

Staff are working closely with all children, and especially our most vulnerable, and any who struggle with change, in order to prepare them so that they are ready and able to enjoy their 'Moving Up Day' too.

# SJF Transition to FS2

Information has been sent out to all the parents and carers of our new FS2 children. It is also available on our SJF website (by clicking <u>here</u>).

There will be a live online meeting for the parents/carers of our new FS2 children at **5.00pm** on **Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2021**. Zoom codes have been shared. The meeting will be recorded for those unable to attend.

Children joining us in September are invited to attend one of three taster sessions being run by our team on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The sessions are timed so that the space can be cleaned and reset for each group. The timings are as follows:

9.30am – 11.00am → Group A 1.30pm – 3.00pm → Group B 4.00pm – 5.30pm → Group C

Parents/carers now know which sessions their children have been allocated. Unfortunately, due to restrictions, we cannot rearrange taster sessions for children unable to attend the sessions allocated to them.

As part of the plan agreed with the Public Health Team, parents/carers are asked to keep us informed if their children (or any member of their households) test positive, exhibit symptoms, or are required to isolate before the taster day. This could mean that a child might not be allowed to visit, but protecting public health by keeping this variant out of school remains our chief priority at this time.

During their time with us, all visiting children will be kept completely separate from other pupils (including older siblings if they have them) and will spend the majority of their time with us in our FS2 outside learning areas. They should wear comfortable clothes, appropriate for the weather and for being outside.

Parents/carers are asked to arrive at least ten minutes before their child's allocated FS2 taster session and queue with their children from the pedestrian gate along the pavement in front of our staff/visitor car park. There are markings painted on railings at two metres intervals, as a guide to help those queuing maintain social distancing. We ask that parents/carers also wear face coverings whilst waiting in the line.

A member of staff will greet queuing parents/carers in turn and ask each to confirm that, to the best of their knowledge, no members of their households are isolating, symptomatic or have tested positive. Once this has been done, the visiting children will be welcomed by FS2 staff and escorted to the FS2 area via the school playground. Unfortunately, parents/carers will not be able to join their children for the session.

At the end of each session, parents/carers should again queue wearing face coverings and wait for their children who will be brought down to them.


### Our June Prayer: 'The Gloria'
