School Council Elections

Here is a message from Mr MacInnes, our School Council Coordinator:

This week at St John Fisher we held the annual Y6 councilor hustings and general election. Ten children from Y6 put themselves forward as candidates for the four senior positions on our SJF School Council:


- Chairperson

Pupil Premium Grant

Operation Encompass



Our school is an **Operation Encompass** school. Operation Encompass is the notification we receive when any of our children has been exposed to, or involved in any form of domestic incident. The notification is usually received at the start of the next school day.

Operation Encompass will ensure that specially trained members of staff on the Safeguarding Team are informed so that they can respond appropriately to support the safety and wellbeing of children and their parents/carers. 
