Class Advent Liturgies

As part of our preparations there will again be daily Advent class liturgies taking place in all classes except on PE days of on days when children are timetabled to have a French or Music lesson during the last period of the day. Unfortunately we will not be able to invite family and friend to join us as we hoped.

Nativity Plays

Sadly, following public health advice it will not be possible to host live audiences for our nativity plays this year.







We have therefore arranged for a film company to come in to school in order to film both the FS2 and KS1 nativity plays this year. This company worked successfully in a number of schools last year and have been booked by lots this year. We hope that a professionally produced DVD will go a small way to making up for the fact that we cannot invite our children's families and friends in to school.

Both nativity plays will be filmed on **Tuesday 14th December 2021**, and so it is important that all the children are in school on that day. A letter will be sent out with further information in due course. Once the films have been edited professionally, the finished DVDs will then be made available directly by the film company to any parents, carers, family and friends who want to buy a copy or copies.

The prices will be as follows:

- a basic DVD is £9.99 and a DVD customised with a message e.g. to a relative for a gift is £12.99
- a basic USB is £12.99 and USB customised with a message e.g. to a relative for a gift is £15.99

Individual children will not be named and the films will not be uploaded to our website. We will issue our usual plea to parents/carers/family/friends **NOT** to upload any part of the film as a video or a still in case the images of other children are captured whose parents/carers do not want them to appear on social media.

Parents and carers who do not want their children to be filmed are asked to contact us as soon as possible. Their children will still be able to take part in the performance, just like their peers, and they will be able enjoy the experience of being on stage, in costume, with all the other children. Their image/scenes will then be edited by the film company so that they do not appear in the finished DVD, before it goes on sale.

Photographs of the children in nativity groups will also be taken, as they have been in previous years, and these will be made available to view and download via our website. Again we request that they are **NOT** uploaded and shared on social media. Only photographs of children who are allowed to have their image(s) on our website will be uploaded and no one will be named. The photographs of the children who cannot appear on the website will be given to their parents/carers directly, so that they have a memento.

Be Safe – Be Happy Week 2021

This week we held our annual 'Be Safe- Be Happy Week'! It turned out to be a fun-packed week created to help our children understand the importance of making good choices and to develop their knowledge and confidence regarding some of the potential hazards and dangers that they might face.

During the week lots of important messages were also shared about respecting themselves and others; about being intolerant of others; about dealing with bullying; about first aid and so much more. Our priority this week and every day has been to enable each and every child to feel happy, safe and loved in and out of school every day. We have also reinforced the importance of disclosing, advising children to Tell! Tell! If something or someone ever makes them feel unhappy, unsafe or unloved.

I would like to thank all the staff for their tremendous hard work this week as well Mr Paige and our friends from South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, LINKS and Taylor Shaw for coming in to support us.

Fire Safety

This week children have been learning about how to be safe from fire in the home. After beginning the week with a visit from fire fighters and the fire engine from South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue all classes (Y1-Y6) had workshops with either Mrs Sambrook or Mrs Hadfield.

The children learned to:

- ✓ tell a grown up and evacuate the building as soon as possible
- never hide, but remain near an open window if not able to leave the building
- ✓ limit the chances of a fire starting by making sure things are unplugged and phones are not charging overnight (especially under pillows whilst sleeping)
- ✓ shut all doors at night

Children were given five minutes to work as a group to come up with fire safety rules for the home. We then shared them and explored some key misconceptions and messages. The children then added further points to their original lists.

Finally we watched a 'Darker Nights' video to remind ourselves how to stay safe around Bonfire Night and during the dark winter months. They key message given repeatedly to the children was to check that their home has a working smoke alarm that is tested monthly.



Building Site Safety

Mr Paige joined us to explain why building sites are not playgrounds, even if they look like exciting places to explore. The children learned that even well managed building sites are full of hidden dangers to those people who should not be there. The children also learned why it is important to stay away from tools that they might come across.

Keeping Healthy

We have promoted exercise and having a healthy outlook as being key for wellbeing and so gave the children opportunities to experience different activities.

We were joined by our friends from Sheffield Karate Club who engaged the children in a range of Martial Art disciplines.

Many children talked excitedly about this session!





The positive impact of eating healthily was explored with our partners from Taylor Shaw (the company that provides our school lunches every day).

The children combined physical exercise and food preparation in order to make fruit smoothies! Everyone had great fun and all the children were then able to enjoy a fruit filled smoothie (with no added sugar) as a reward for all their hard work!







Road Safety

Mrs Raynes and Mrs Barrett led workshops on how to stay safe while using roads and pavements. The children realised that everybody needs to use roads and pavements to get about, so we needed to be responsible and look after one another in order to keep safe. The children learnt where it was safe and not safe to cross a road and how to do it by **stopping**, **listening** and **looking** in order to make sure it is safe before stepping out into the road.








This week's feature book for younger children is What is Poo? by Katie Daynes.

Our statement next week is 'I try to stand up for myself and others without hurting others.'


Time to talk: Each of us is important, and during 'Be Safe – Be Happy Week' we have reflected on just how special we are. We all deserve to be treated with respect.
