
SJF Chaplaincy Team Update: The SJF Penny War 2022

It is time for the SJF Penny War, in aid of the Bishop's 'Good Shepherd Appeal' to commence!

The pupils are invited to collect pennies and two-pence pieces in their class collecting jars at the beginning of each day.

A penny is worth one point and a two-pence piece is worth two points. However, silver coins can be used to sabotage another class's total because silver coins deposited into the jar of another class jar will reduce the total number of points in that jar. A 5p piece will reduce the total number of points accumulated by 5 points, 10p will reduce the total by 10 points, 20p by 20 points and 50p by 50 points.







At the end of the week the coins will be counted and once all ocese of Hallam deductions have been made, the victorious class will be announced and rewarded with some 'Golden Time'. All money raised will be passed on to support the vital work of our key Diocesan charities.




Our recommendation for older children is

Grill's beautiful use of coloured pencils and vibrant hues places him somewhere on the artistic spectrum between Raymond Briggs and David Hockney and his fastidious cataloguing of every single detail of the expedition is nothing short of a Blackstock collection. He manages to evoke the atmosphere and intrepid excitement that would have surrounded the expedition with his impeccably researched, detailed and atmospheric drawings.

Children will love examining the exploded diagrams of the now peculiar provisions taken and the individual drawings of each sled dog and pack horse. 






SJF Curriculum Showcase
