Loving God, We pray for the people of Ukraine -For all those suffering or afraid -That you will be close to them and protect them.


We pray for world leaders -That they will have the compassion, strength and wisdom to guide their choices. We pray for the world -

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SJF Chaplaincy Team Update: Extension of the SJF Penny War

Do not forget our 2022 Penny War in support of the bishop's 'Good Shepherd Appeal'! The children are invited to collect pennies and two-pence pieces in the individual class collecting jars.

A penny is worth one point and a two-pence piece is worth two points.

However, silver coins can be used to sabotage another class's total because silver coins deposited into the jar of another class jar will reduce the total number of points in that jar.

A **5p** piece will reduce the total number of points accumulated by **5** points, **10p** will reduce the total by **10** points, **20p** by **20** points and **50p** by **50** points.



At the end of the week the coins will be counted and once all deductions have been made, the victorious class will be announced and rewarded with some 'Golden Time'. All money raised will be passed on to support the vital work of our Diocesan caring services.

Wonder is the unforgettable story of August Pullman, an ordinary boy with an extraordinary face.


With over 5 million copies sold, Wonder is a true modern classic, a life-changing read, and has inspired kindness and acceptance in countless readers.

It's the perfect way for families and teachers to talk about empathy, difference and kindness with young children.








A Planet Full of Plastic: The Waterstones Review

How can you help someone in trouble in and out of school?


Perhaps you can help others by simply doing the right thing ourselves, and setting a great example?
