Statutory Assessments (SATs)

Attendance continues to be extremely importance as a number of statutory and internal assessments are ongoing. A reminder that the Y6 statutory writing assessments continue and these will be moderated formally by the local authority in the coming weeks. It is important that the children are present, in school, every day, so that they can do all that is required. Statutory assessments are also ongoing for our Y2 children and, of course, our Y1 pupils will face a national phonics screening at the beinning of June, alongside those Y2 pupils who did not meet the national standard when they were in Y1 last year.

Moving Up Days



'DK Superheroes' by Shirley Hughes: The Waterstones Review


Some heroes have capes and trusty sidekicks too, but how many of these superheroes have ever rescued you?

Perfect for children aged 3-7 years, this wonderful picture book is dedicated to brave front-line workers - the real heroes who look after us!










The Big Book of Football by Mondial: The Waterstones Review

Statement of Belief


Our 'Statement of Belief' is, "I understand what trust means."
