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

Assessments

Statutory Assessments (SATs)

Attendance continues to be extremely importance as a number of statutory assessments continue in June. The children of **Y6** continue to produce written work for their statutory writing assessments. Their writing (and our judgements of it) will be moderated formally by the local authority next term.

The children of **Y1** will undergo phonics screening in the first week back along with those in **Y2** who did not meet national expectations when they were in **Y1**. Other **Y2** statutory assessments will also be continue. It is therefore very important that all children are present, in school, every day.

Please avoid taking children out of school unless absolutely necessary, including for holidays in term-time. The lost learning can have a huge impact on children's wellbeing, progress and achievement. A reminder that support for better attendance is available from both the school and the local authority, and any parents/carers concerned about their children's attendance are invited to speak to Mr Smith. Amen.




Achievements outside of School

Rain Before Rainbows by Smriti Halls: The Waterstones Review


An uplifting, stunningly beautiful book about optimism in the darkest of places.

A book with immense hope at its heart, this is a positive message for anyone who's ever gone through a tough time.




Ultimate Football Heroes: KANE by Matt and Tom Oldfield: The Waterstones Review
