At St John Fisher we believe strongly that it is important to honour Remembrance Day and the sacrifice made by our soldiers and their families through the years to the present day. All children will spend time leading up to Armistice Day reflecting on the origins of Remembrance Day and why it is so important. We will also pray for peace and remember all who are (or have been) affected by war.



On 11th of November we hold our annual Community Service of Remembrance at Our Lady of Lourdes church at 10.30am and you are all invited. We also invite anyone from our community who would like to join us, particularly current or ex-service personnel and their families. So please pass on this invitation to them

If they would like to take part in the service, by simply taking the class wreaths from some children and laying them at the foot of a cross we would really appreciate it and ask that you pass us their details so that we can get in touch. I would also like to hear from any former or current members of the armed services who would be prepared to come into school to talk to the children about why Remembrance Day is important to them. Opportunities like this can really help the children's understanding.

Poppies will be on sale after the holiday (from 2nd November), so we ask that children bring in a contribution for the Royal British Legion if they would like one. Thank you.


I would like to thank Mrs Prentice for all her hard work in organising the Christmas cards. All money raised will be given to the Student Council to spend on their projects.

Statement to Live By


When we return our 'statement to live by' will be "I try to be just and fair!"
