Remembrance 2022

Today we came together as a community of school and parish, in a simple act of worship and remembrance, to mark Armistice Day, as we do every year. Throughout the week - and in age-appropriate ways - the children in every class have been learning about the origins of Remembrance Sunday and have explored the significance of the poppy as a national symbol of remembrance. It is important that in their time with us, the children develop, gently, an appreciation of why this moment is important in the life of our country, so that they understand. As part of our work and prayers, we have also reflected on our shared hope for peace in the UK and throughout the world.





Our service was led by the young people of Y6, who shared words, poems and prayers. Over the week, all the children made their own poppies which were added to simple wreaths. In one special moment, during the service, representatives of each class processed slowly from the back of the church to lay their wreaths at the foot of a simple wooden cross on the Sanctuary, just before 'The Last Post', was played.

We thank Fr Bede, for allowing us to use the church, as well as the family, friends, parishioners and members of our local community who were able to join us. Due to circumstances beyond our control, no poppies were delivered for us to sell in support of the great work of the Royal British Legion. 




