The Hub Mini Lectures

The Hub operates at lunch time for children in Years 3 to 6. It is run by Mr Smith, our Learning and Inclusion Mentor, supported by our SJF Healthy Minds Champions. Its purpose is to provide a space for children to talk, read, complete homework with or without support and to access online resources safely for projects, homework and to support learning.

Here is a message from Mr Smith:

The Hub is also launching a series of small lectures designed to give the children a chance to learn more about those things that interest them; anything from politics and popular culture, to history, science and the arts. The Hub Mini-Lectures will aim to give the children an opportunity to listen and learn, and take part in quizzes, to win prizes and create amazing work with you - their family & friends - at home. This work can then be displayed around school.

Each lecture will be presented every Tuesday and Wednesday in the Y5 classroom and will focus on different the topics. The lectures will be repeated on a weekly basis, so that the children never have to miss out!

It will be a fantastic opportunity parents/carers and their children to work together and to also maybe win prizes for their efforts!



Advent and Lent, are seasons of penitence. On the Advent wreath, the three purple candles mark our preparations while awaiting the arrival of Christ on Earth at Christmas. Unlike Lent, Advent is a happier season. The Third Sunday of Advent, called **Gaudete Sunday**. The word 'Gaudate' is Latin for 'rejoice'. From the third Sunday of Advent we light the rose coloured candle on our wreaths. Priests also wear rose-coloured vestments at Mass on the third Sunday of Advent. Pope Francis was talking about the difference between happiness and joy when he said:

"To be happy is good, yet joy is something more. It's another thing; something which does not depend on external motivations, or on passing issues. It is more profound. It is a gift."

If joy is a gift from the Lord, then the Lord Himself is our first and greatest gift, and the only one that will never tarnish, break or fade. Gaudete Sunday reminds us that the gift has not yet arrived, but is very near...




