The Comic Relief 2023 Appeal

We are sometimes get asked why we do not do more to support the Comic Relief and Sport Relief appeals, so I thought I would take this opportunity to explain. Firstly, it is important to say that we all acknowledge and appreciate the fantastic work by these two great appeals in support of different initiatives, projects and charities that help to change the lives, for the better, for so many people across the UK and Africa.



In the past there were issues around some of the projects funded by the appeals. It was felt that they conflicted with aspects of Catholic doctrine. In recent years, however, this issue has been addressed by the Comic Relief and Sport Relief appeals who now offer Catholic schools a guarantee that any money raised by them will be used only in support of projects that do not conflict with Catholic teaching and beliefs.

Hallam Catholic schools welcome this assurance, but are also mindful of our bishop's sincere hope that we will also do all we can to support the vital and ongoing work of the smaller and lesser-known Catholic charities, services and projects, that exist under the umbrella of the 'Diocese of Hallam Caring Services'. These charities help the most vulnerable and marginalised in our city and surrounding areas, the old, the young and families, day in and day out. We are therefore proud to do all we can to support our Bishop's wishes and his appeal.

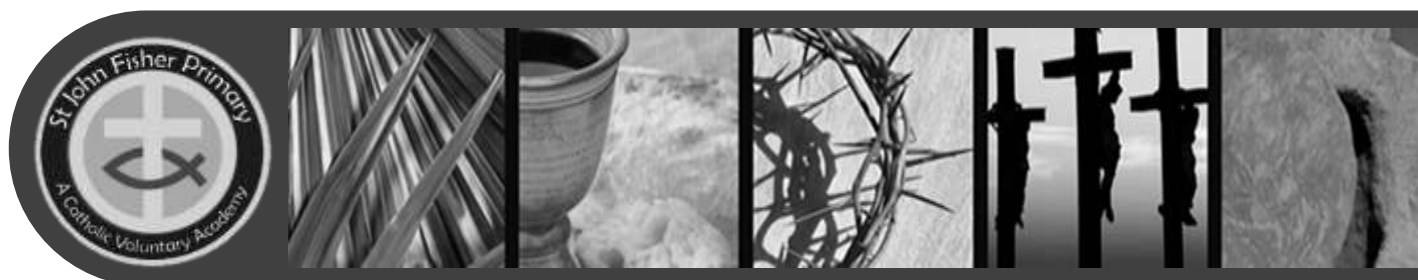

We also need to have the self-belief, drive and determination to keep trying, again and again, until we achieve what we want to achieve.

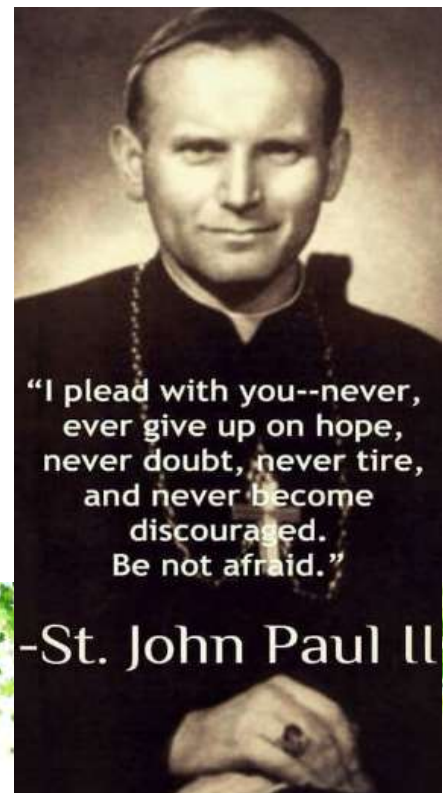
It is so important to trust ourselves and others too. We know that everyone at SJF and at home wants us to succeed and will help us.
