Homework

Children will be given homework every week on Friday and this will be due back by the following Thursday. The homework will be:

- 'MyMaths' online homework (which will be differentiated to the correct level for your child)
- 'Bug Club' for reading homework
- Spellings to learn for a quiz

RE

Information about the RE curriculum for Terms 3 and 4 was shared in the 'Come and See' letter sent out in January.

English: Basic Skills – Reading, Phonics, Spelling and Handwriting

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from having regular handwriting and spelling practise and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their individual needs.

Literacy Sessions

This term, we will be focusing on writing scientific reports relating to the science topic: Electricity. The children will we writing investigations, explanations and some discussion texts.



You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ supporting them to learn their weekly spellings
- ✓ talking about their targets for writing

Guided Reading

All children have daily reading activities to boost their levels of confidence and enjoyment as well as their comprehension skills. This is a very important part of reading and can be overlooked.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading your child's reading books with them for a few minutes every day (as well as other books)
- ✓ encouraging your child to read a wider range of more challenging books in order to widen their experience
- ✓ talking about their targets for reading

Mathematics: Daily Number & Calculation Skills

We will focus on the following this term:

- Continuing to practice the four operation (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Looking at worded problems and how these can be solved using the bar method.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ encouraging your child to look at different numbers around them and thinking carefully about what each digit represents for example; in 56, the 5 actually means 50 and so on...
- ✓ practising times tables each night extremely important

Theme 2: 'We have the Power!'

Our main curriculum topic this term will be *Empires* and *Explorers*. All of our art, geography, D.T. and science will be covered through this topic.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ researching empires and explorers in Britain and the World in general, and the Vikings specifically
- ✓ discussing the different ways that we find out about the past and how we can use historical evidence
- ✓ talking to your child about staying safe online and knowing what/who they are viewing/engaging with

English: Creative Writing within the Theme

Our main focus this term will be on the Science topic of Electricity. The children will be writing reports, explanations and discussion texts.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading books about electricity
- ✓ looking at the layout and structure of reports i.e. non-fiction books

Science within the Theme

We will be investigating electricity.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ researching electrical circuits
- ✓ discussing electrical safety within the home

Computing within the Theme

We will be looking at the creativity strand, which will focus on producing digital music.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

✓ listening to different types of electrically generated music



Music

Music is taught by Miss Pendlebury, our specialist music teacher and during our 'Dragon Scales' topic the pupils will:

- ✓ Explore melodies and scales
- ✓ Learn to recognise the intervals of a melody
- ✓ Sing various songs and using glockenspiels to play them

ΡΕ

This term they will focus on Tag Rugby and continuing with 'FUNdementals' (multi skills). The Year 3 and 4 after school club this term is Multi skills.

French

We will be recapping numbers 0 – 15 and getting to know you (good day, asking and giving our names, how we are and our age, goodbye and thank you). We will be revisiting colours and learning to say what our favourite colour is. We will also be learning some foods and how to say which foods are healthy and which are not, as well as learning the days of the week.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising numbers 0-15 and using them in everyday conversation
- ✓ asking your child to teach you how to ask for and give your name and how you are and practice getting to know you questions
