Ash Wednesday

On Wednesday our school community came together for our Ash Wednesday Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church. I would like to thank Mrs Holloway and the young people of Y5 for preparing and leading the liturgy so beautifully. Lent

Ash Wednesday marks the start of Lent, a time of preparation for Easter - the greatest Christian feast. Lent ends with Holy Week which recalls events leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. Lent lasts for six weeks or forty days and does not include Sundays. It is a special time when Christians reflect on the direction of their lives and decide whether there are things they need to change. It is also a time when Christians think of others and think about doing more, or fasting and giving something up. All of these actions are about making changes for the better so that we can be the best we can be and in doing so, grow closer to God.

Good Shepherd Lenten Appeal – The SJF Penny War!

During Lent we will be collecting for St Patrick's House charity, 'The Good Shepherd Appeal'. We will have a penny war! During a penny war we invite the children to collect pennies and two-pennies. These can be placed in a class collecting tins at the beginning of the school day. A penny is worth 1 point and a two-pence coin is worth 2 points.









Sabotage!

Silver coins can also be used to sabotage the efforts of another class! Any Silver coins added to the tin of another class will reduce the amount of points in that tin:

- 5p will reduce the total in the tin by 5 points
- 10p will reduce the total in the tin by 10 points
- 20p will reduce the total in the tin by 20 points etc.

The class tins will be placed in the School Hall each lunchtime for the children to add their silver coins (if they have them) to a tin of their choice. The aim is to add silver coins to the tins which look the most full.

At the end of the Term 4, the class tins will be opened and all the coins counted and points added up. The silver coins in each tin will also be counted and the necessary deductions will then be made from the final total. The class which has collected the most will receive a Golden Time for a whole afternoon, as a reward.

Our Penny War will begin the first week of Term 4.

All money raised will be donated to support the Bishop's annual 'Good Shepherd' appeal which supports the vital work of small Diocesan charities and support services. These help people all over the Diocese (which covers South Yorkshire, north Derbyshire and north Nottinghamshire).

Get Set, GO!

When we return for the start of Term 4 (27-02-18) there will be significant changes to the start of the school day. We are introducing our new daily 'Get Set, GO!' sessions which are designed to engage the children in learning at the very start of the day with a range of fun and motivating Mathematics and English activities and challenges.

Wake Up & Shake Up!

Our popular daily 'Wake Up & Shake Up' session will now take place on the playground every day at **8.40am**. The children will then go straight into class from 8.45am in order to join in with the 'Get Set, GO!' challenges.

Please note that this means there will be no more lining up before school.

The start of the school day will remain the same but all children will be encouraged to arrive at school to take part in the 'Get, Set, GO!' sessions if they can. We are very confident that the sessions will help, giving all children a vital learning boost to set them up for the day.

This means that children will only receive a late mark if they are late for the official start of school (and not if they do not arrive in time to take part in the 'Get Set, GO!' session). Children who miss the 'Get Set, GO!' session but arrive in time for the official start of the school day will also go straight to class. Staff will continue to monitor the gate as soon it is unlocked, as we do currently.

Bad Weather

In the event of poor weather before school everyone will continue to go straight into the School Hall, as we do currently. The children will then go to their classrooms from 8.45am for their 'Get Set, GO!' sessions. Pupils arriving after 8.45am when the weather' is bad will go straight to their classes via the School Hall.
