Uniform

School Trends

I met with Jayne Burgess, a Regional Sales Manager from School Trends, this week in order to discuss the various problems faced by some of our parents and carers. It was a positive meeting during which the issues which had led to severe delays in the supply of uniform (already paid for); missed delivery dates; the lack of accurate information; the difficulties faced by parents/carers trying to speak to someone; the quality of some items; problems with the logo and frustrations that the shop had closed were all acknowledged. Ms Burgess apologised for the upset and annoyance caused and explained that there had been a major problem with the supply process which led to orders not being processed and a significant backlog developing. She assured me that everyone at School Trends and their suppliers were working hard to rectify things.

I then shared all the emails sent to me by parents/carers and I asked that they be responded to individually and Ms Burgess has committed to do this. Please let me know if you do not hear from School Trends and I will follow it up. The 'rogue' logo has been deleted so no garments should be produced with it from now on. Anyone who purchased items with the wrong logo can have them replaced. 






Achievements outside of School
